THE RELEVANCE OF THE PROJECT

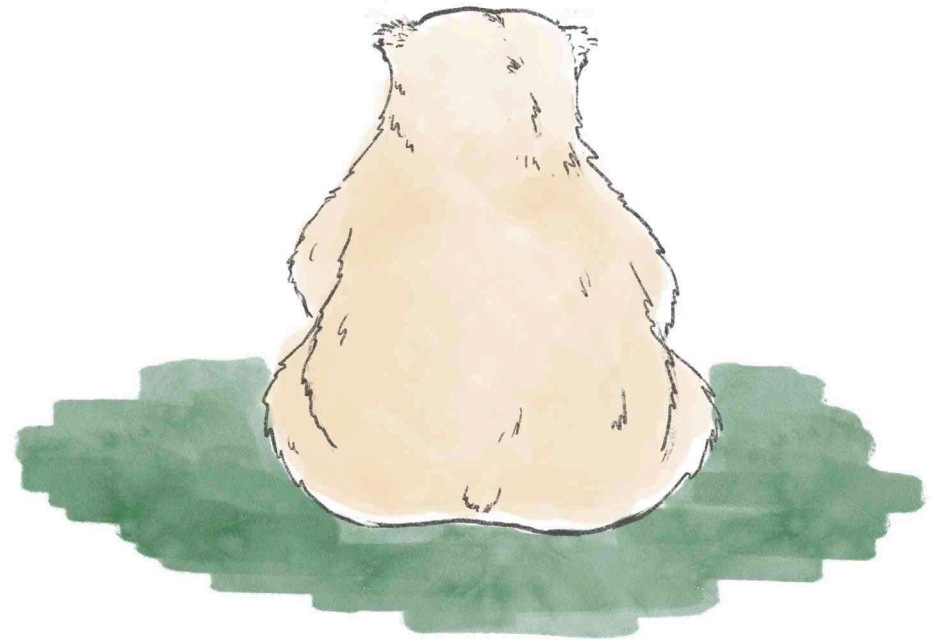
According to statistics, in 2020 14% percent of houtholds in the EU, which have children, are single-parent families, with this share higher than 20% in some countries (e.g. Sweden -34%, Denmark - 29%, France - 21%). In the US 23% of children are raised in single-parent families or with no parents at all.

According to WHO (2019), 36% of children worldwide suffer from emotional abuse and 16% of physical neglect.

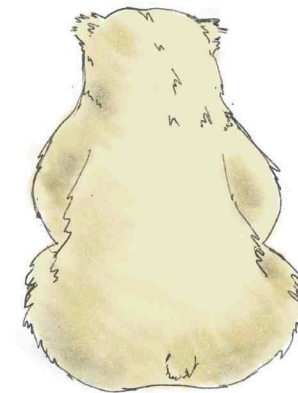
As the everyday life of parents becomes more and more stressful, especially in big cities, kids meet with the detached attitude of one or both parents, parents who might be in depression, have an addiction, take care about a disabled family member and so on.

All these situations evoke variety of feelings and questions in children's mind. One of them: Where is my Dad? Or Mom? Why he (or she) is not with me (physically or emotionally)? Why others have him (or her or them both) and I don't?

The story «Where is my Dad?» is an artistic rethinking of an author's personal story who learned from her own experience that difficulties of the childhood can be overcome and one can grow into a thriving adult despite of anything. To do it you only need an adult's support and you yourself. Knowing this, the autor considers this to be important to give a helping hand with this book to kids and adults in difficult live circumstances.



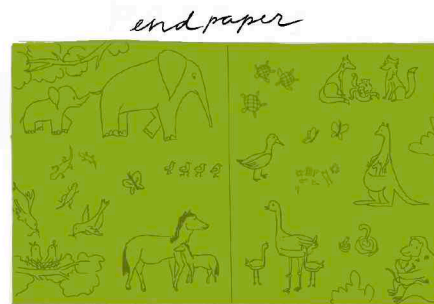

So generally, the Little Bear's life's was just excellent, and he was happy.

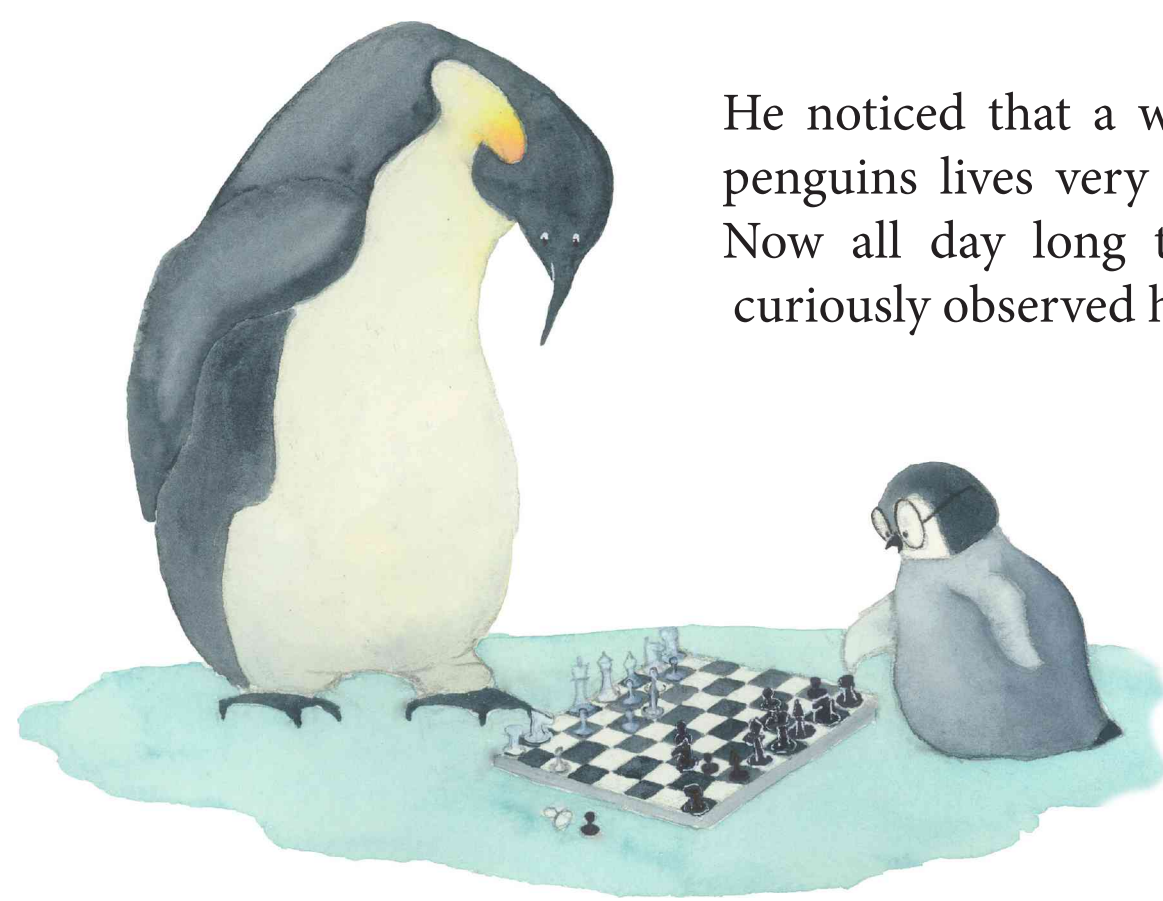

“It’s not like bears live at all,” - the Little Bear discoursed. “But I have my Mom, and this is the most important.”

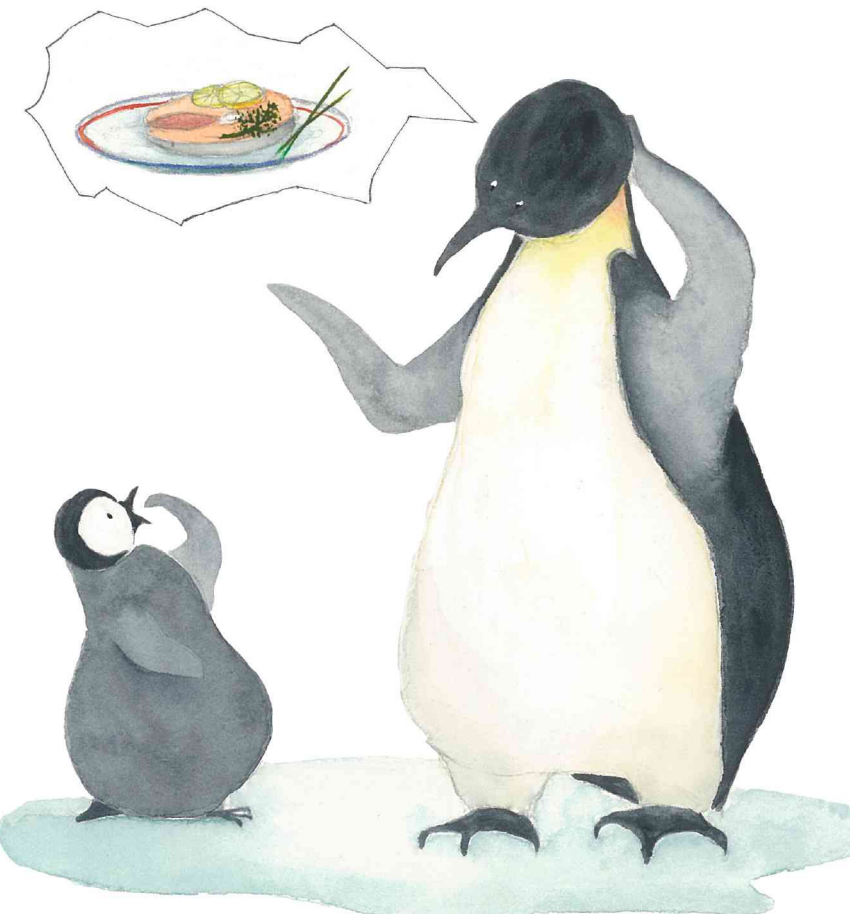
He noticed that a whole family of penguins lives very close to them. Now all day long the Little Bear curiously observed his neighbours.



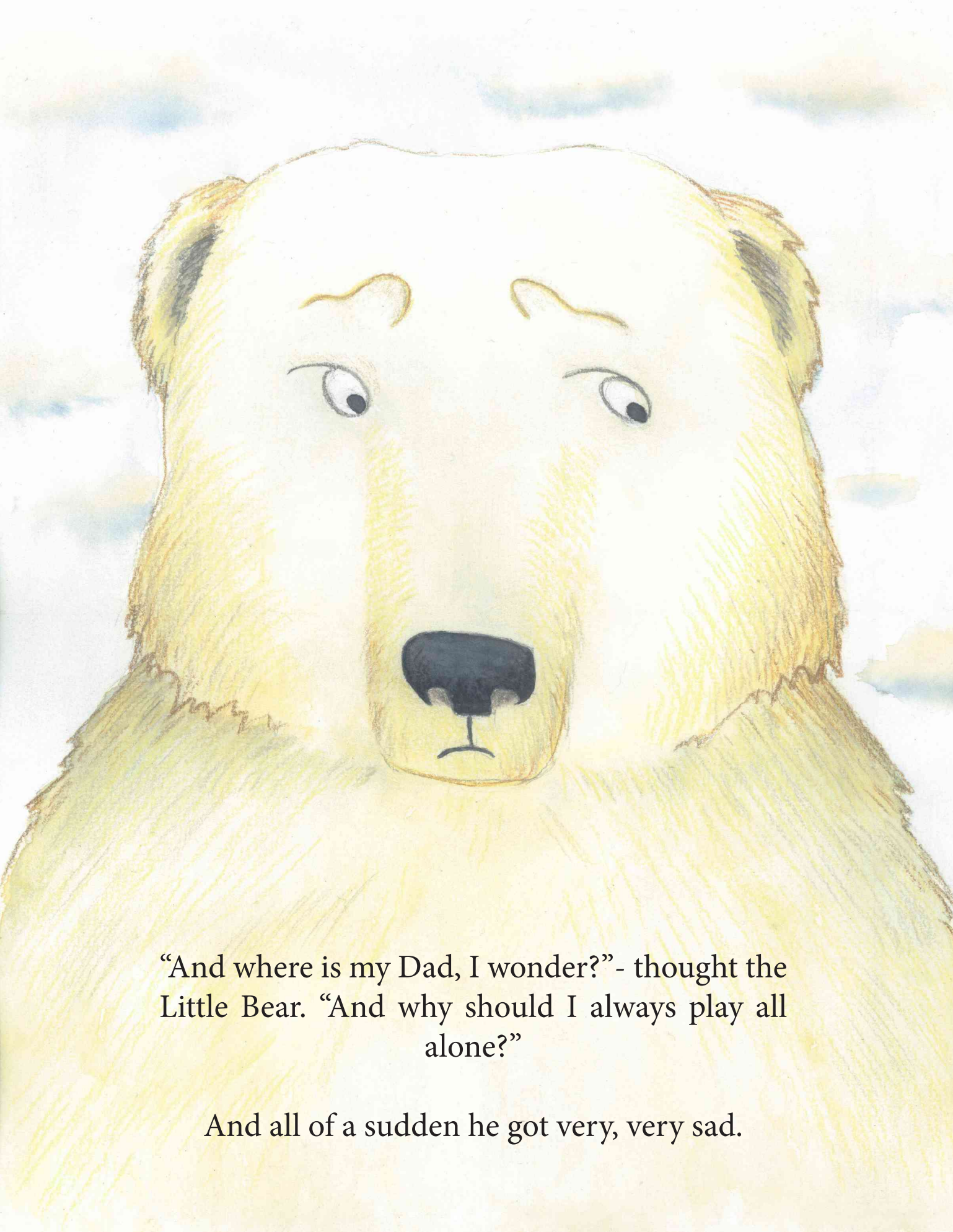
He didn't let the Little Penguin get lost, played with him, fed him and warmed him up with his warm soft belly in the evenings.



He saw that a Little Penguin's Mom has been spending all days long in a big swimming pool while a big Father-Penguin stayed to look after his little one.

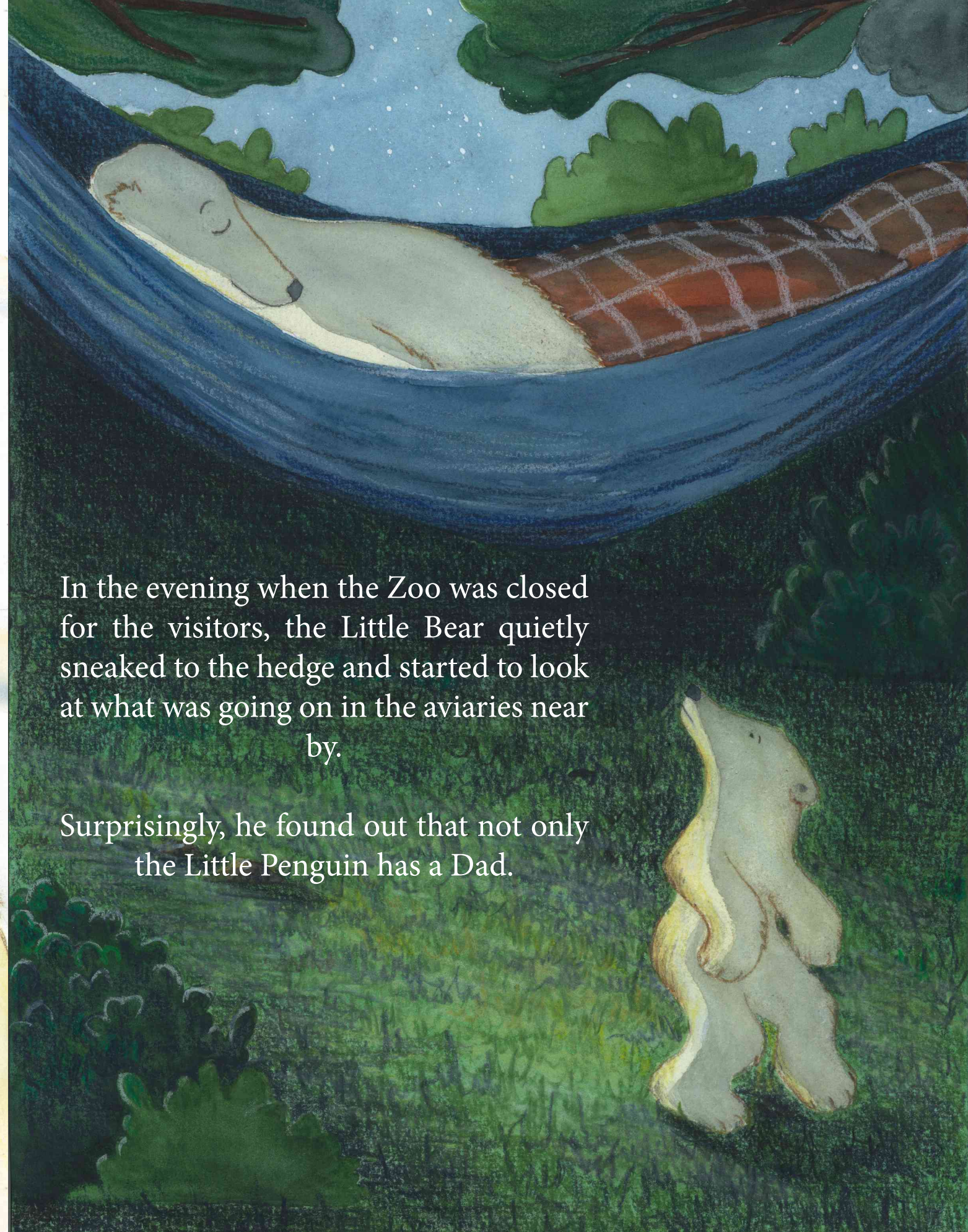


Then he switched with the Little Penguin's Mom but Father-penguin always returned to his baby.

Sad, he looked at the Aquarium. There was a Seahorse swimming. He had a special bag full of his kids - the Little Seahorses.

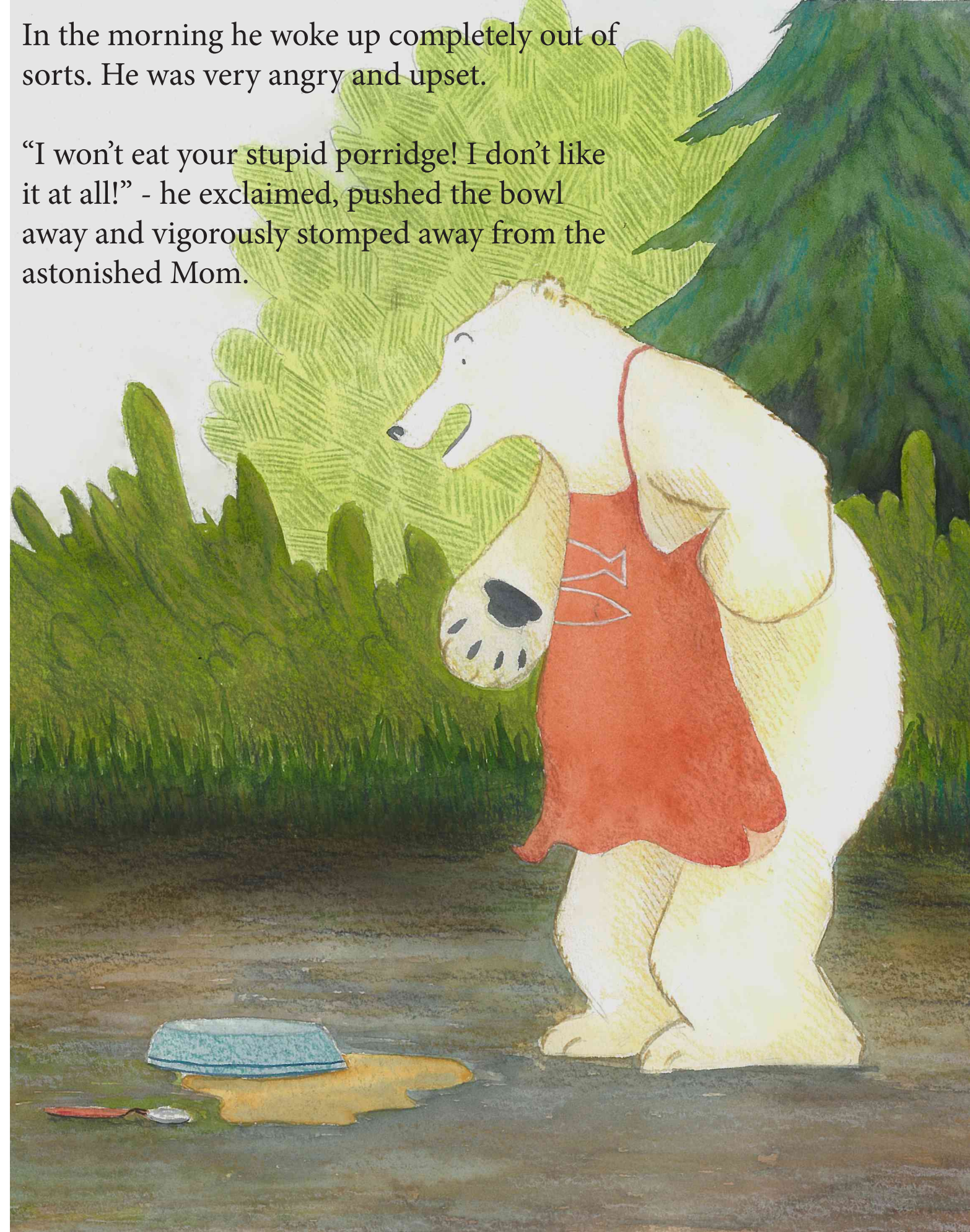

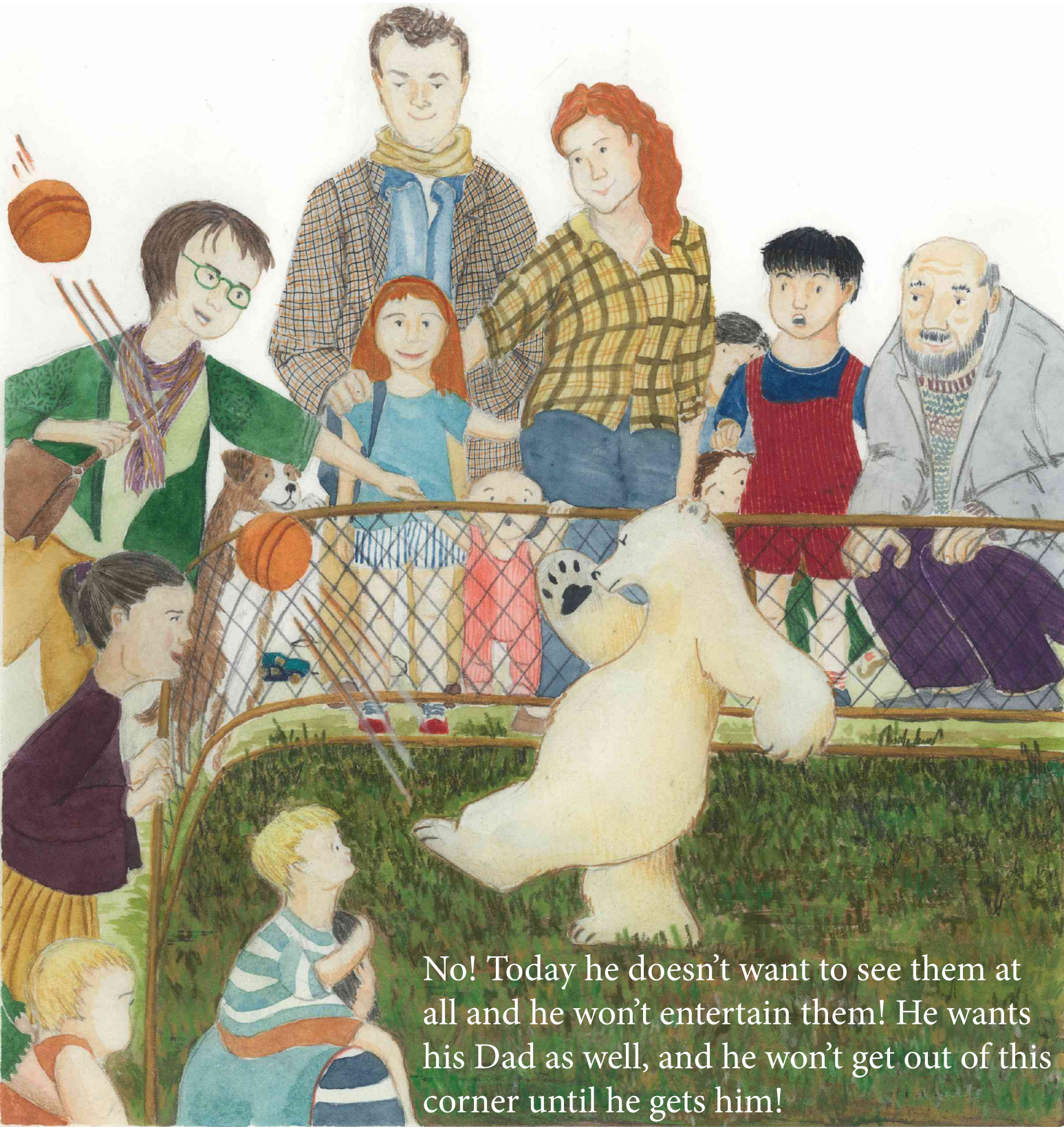

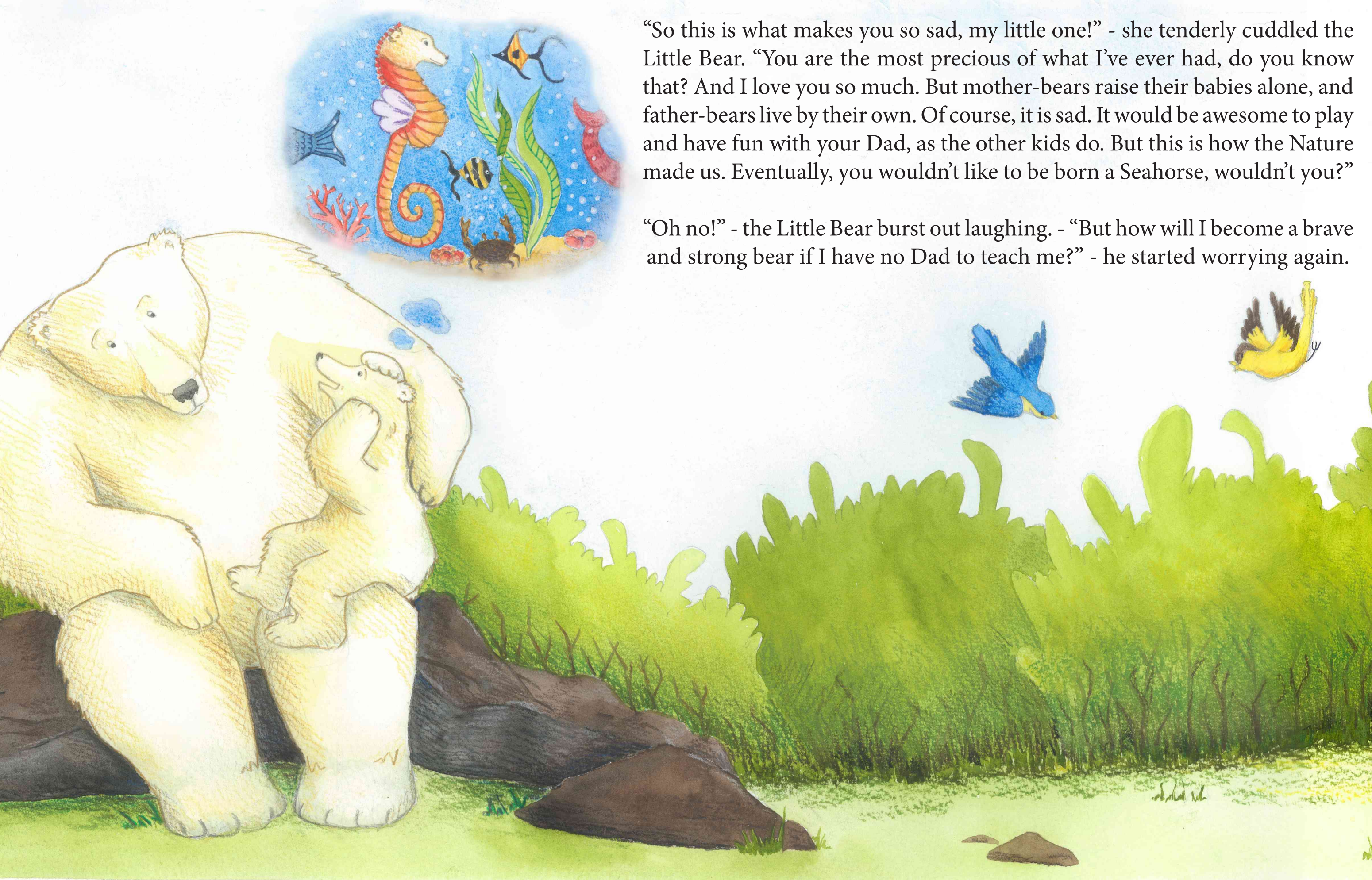
